

Suspecting Cushing's

Cushing's syndrome is an endocrine disorder in dogs that can be notoriously hard to diagnose. This is because the symptoms can be hard to spot, and may be mistaken as signs of old age.

- ☐ Increased urination and/or increased thirst
- ☐ Increased appetite
- ☐ Lethargy
- ☐ Hair loss
- ☐ Excessive panting
- ☐ Other symptoms, such as pot belly and muscle weakness

If your dog is displaying any of the above symptoms, it could be a reason to suspect Cushing's. If you are concerned about the health of your pet, visit your vet for a professional diagnosis.
